Commit to student well-being by eliminating hygiene barriers in your school restrooms



1 in 5

students have avoided hydration because they don't want to use the restrooms.¹

Safety

Creating a safe and welcoming restroom environment is essential for students' well-being. Restrooms should be placed in calm, visible areas that feel comfortable for students. It is important restrooms are not located in overly busy zones or in secluded spots where natural supervision is limited. It's also important that students feel confident in their privacy, including having reliable stall door locks.

Cleaning frequency

A school restroom has often more traffic than a regular office restroom, yet it's usually cleaned less often.² Cleaning at the right times and increasing rounds during peak hours makes a big difference in how restrooms are perceived. Regular rounds also ensure dispensers are stocked, so students don't run out of essentials like soap, paper towels and period care products.

Meeting the needs of as many as possible

Schools are the training grounds where students practice the skills they'll use in the workforce. Just like workplaces support a wide range of individual needs, so should schools. Students may have diverse conditions such as neurodivergence, low vision, OCD or heightened hygiene sensitivities that affect how they learn and interact. Creating restrooms that are adapted to these differences isn't just supportive; it's essential for students to feel safe and be able to perform at their best.



Why students avoid school restrooms²:

- 45% bad smell
- 43% consider them unclean and gross
- 32% fear that someone outside can hear what they are doing
- 30% dirty toilet seat or urinal
- 28% out of toilet paper
- 24% fear that someone will open the door from the outside
- 21% are afraid of germs
- 20% out of soap
- 17% it feels unsafe

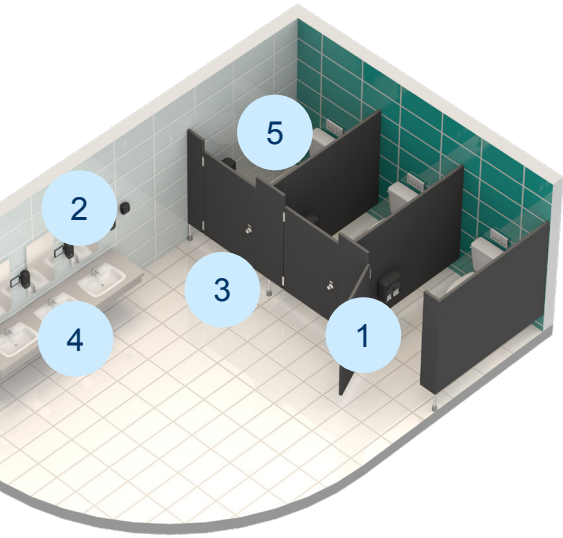

Act now:

1. Ensure stall door locks are fully functional to maintain student privacy, which is essential for safety and comfort in educational environments.
2. Regularly refill soap dispensers with hypoallergenic soap to support proper hand hygiene, especially for students with sensitive skin or eczema.
3. Increase cleaning frequency during peak hours as restrooms often are high-traffic and high-touch environments.
4. Ensure child-friendly height and ergonomic design for younger students and those with limited hand strength.
5. Always (plan cleaning routines to) stock toilet paper, hand towels and soap. Keep toilets clean and fresh, display a cleaning schedule so students know when it was last cleaned.
